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CHAPTER 1 GENERAL

Article 1

1. The purpose of this Chapter is to establish the general principles and objectives of the legal system, ensuring the protection of the rights and interests of the citizens and the maintenance of the social order.

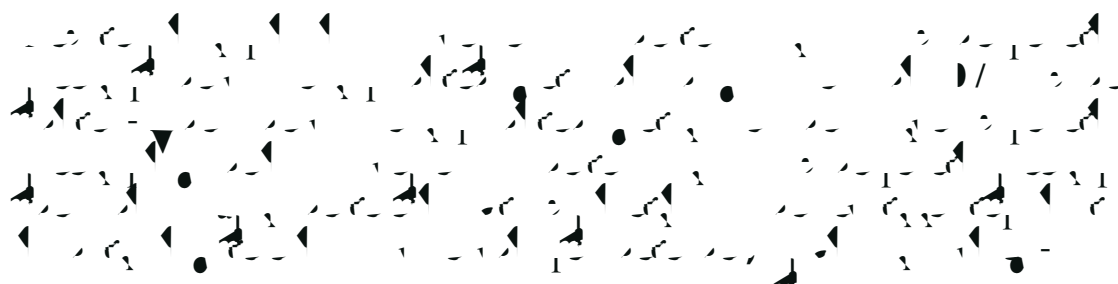
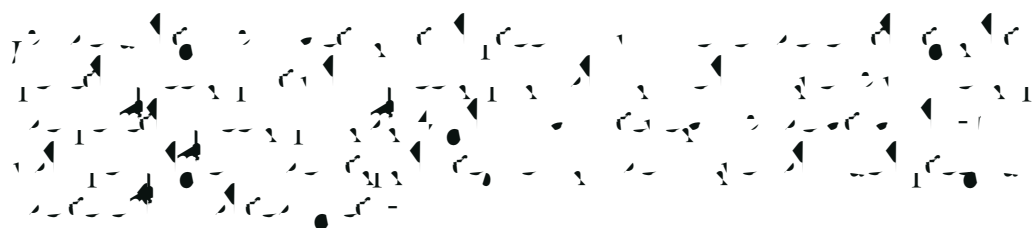
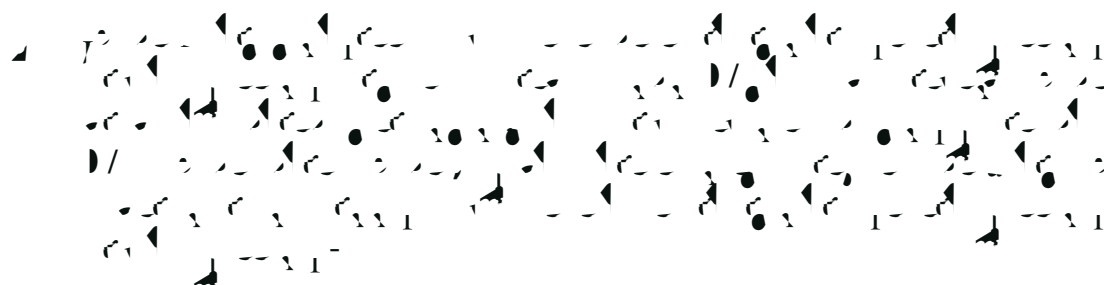
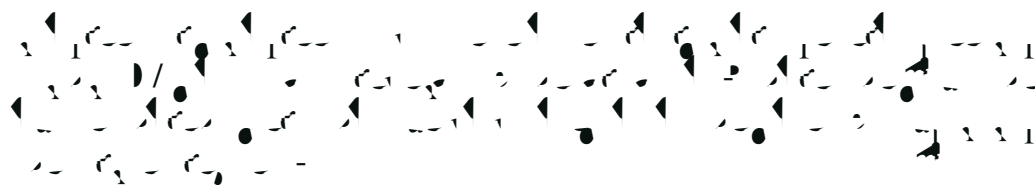

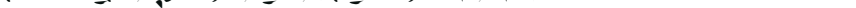

CHAPTER 10 BOARD OF DIRECTORS

Section 1 Directors

Article 118

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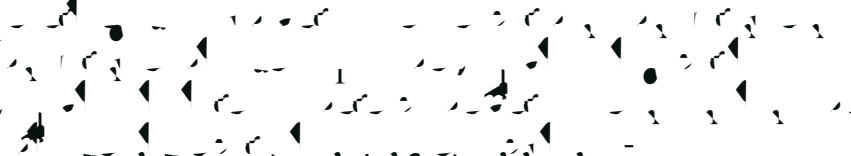
